


Conservation Commission
14 June 2010



Regular Meeting - 6:30PM

Present: Chairman Heck, Lloyd, Meehan, Spillane Belter,
Lankler Rand (Ex-officio) - Oliver

1) Agenda #2A added: Dina Krissel application for review of road repair Jeff Haydock representing.

2) Minutes: A motion was made by Lloyd, 2nd by Meehan, All: Aye to correct the minutes of 13 May to reflect that the planting of conifers on the East and South side of the proposed pond was required for shade.

2A) Mr. Haydock explained the action necessary to stabilize Covered Bridge Road and replace a blocked culvert which is allowing drainage water to flow over the road. The proposal would berm against the downhill side of the road on property owned by Dina Krissel at 47 Covered Bridge Road. Upon the stabilization of the roadway a proposal to center the road in the existing ROW would move the traveled way from the embankment. The area of repair is non-wetland soils with a drainage area for the old culvert. Spillane discussed the need to prevent invasive plants in the deposited and disturbed areas. After a lengthy discussion the Commission decided that no permit was necessary on a motion of Spillane, 2nd Lankler, All:Aye.

3) A review of the plans submitted to P&Z by John Allee brought a motion by Lankler, 2nd Belter, All:Aye that "No exception was taken for the house project as proposed to P&Z."

4) A review of the shoreline activity proposed by John Allee, to change the seawall by removing the pressure treated wood and replacing it with stone, is environmentally sensitive in removal of CCA treated lumber from the water. The Commission asks for a site plan of native plantings to stabilize the disturbed area.

5) The members reviewed the changes made to the Friedrich pond which include location of conifers on the areas to the

East and South. On a motion bt Meehan, 2nd by Lloyd, All:Aye the plan was approved.

6) Informational correspondence from DEP approving activities at Indian Mountain School was read.

7) A discussion of the P&Z reaction to the Twin Lakes proposal of restrictions in the "Lake overlay Zone" resulted in a consensus that the Commission must amend the current regulation to support the Overlay zone. A discussion of enforcement ensued and the discussion will continue.
