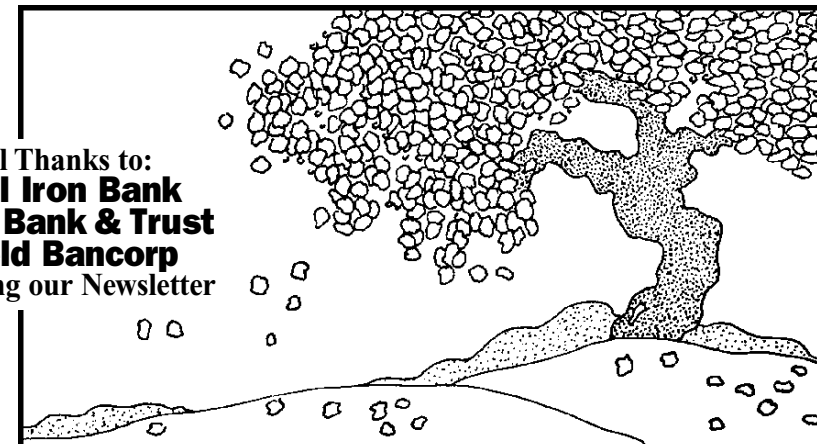
FUEL ASSISTANCE

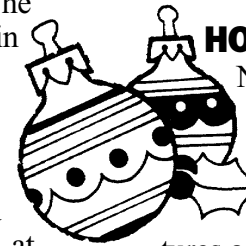
CIVIL WAR LITERATURE, II
