

TRAC Meeting

June 17, 2010

The monthly meeting of TRAC was held on June 16 in the Salisbury Town Hall.

Members Present: Charlie Kelley, Chair, Anthy Hellmers, Paul Henrici, Bob Palmer, Ed Reagan, Betsy Smith. Also present: First Selectmen Bob Loucks & Curtis Rand, SSTS Manager Brian Bartram. Members absent: Barbara Bettingole, Malcolm Brown, Patricia Chamberlain.

Chairman Kelley called the meeting to order at 6:39 pm.

Ed Reagan moved that the evening's agenda be approved. Bob Loucks seconded and all approved.

Ed Reagan moved that the minutes of April 21, 2010, be approved. Bob Loucks seconded and all approved.

Brian Bartram gave the Manager's Report. He said that the new cameras are proving to be handy, allowing them to use license plates to run down people who break rules. He reported that the swap shop office has been painted and that a new 2010 roll-off truck and tractor have been purchased. He said that the annual stickers for residents of the 2 towns are now available.

The Committee revisited the new state list of town -mandated recyclables. Bob Palmer moved to accept this list of recyclables as stated. Ed Reagan seconded and all approved.


A brief discussion ensued on single stream recycling and that our new recycling center must be designed to take us down the road 40 or 50 years from now. Bob Palmer suggested that TRAC make no decisions on single stream because Anchor Engineering can help us with the decision. Everyone agreed.

Brian reported that people who come to the recycling center are still looking for composting. Everyone agreed that composting is the simplest, most effective way to get rid of the waste stream. It was reported that 32.1% of the disposables in the state are organic. Curtis reported that he is now composting at his home at the rate of one ton annually. Everyone agreed that TRAC must pass the word out into the community that people must do more composting. And Ed Reagan went further: He moved that on a loan basis the TRAC give 4 composters and 4 kitchen buckets to "Lakeville Journal" staff. Paul Henrici seconded the motion and all approved.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:29 pm.
