I am writing to state my objection to the proposal to construct 2 houses on the 26-28 Undermountain Road block. I am a supporter of the Affordable Housing Initiative in Salisbury, but feel that this lot is too small for the addition of the houses. The space is too valuable to the town's children using the park and to the town's businesses using the parking lot. We need to preserve these opportunities!

Right now the lot has a children's park which is used often. The parking lot is useful to businesses in Town and is used a lot. With these two entities - the park and the parking lot - the space is used efficiently and sufficiently.

Additionally, the Town received a grant to construct a sidewalk on Rt. 41 going North, so in a couple of years there will be a sidewalk connecting the parking lot and the children's park with the Town Center and with the Sarum Village of affordable housing. The children from Sarum Village will be able to walk and/or bike to the park using the sidewalk. We need the park to remain open and be of a sufficient size. The 2 houses will crowd that space unnecessarily.

With this, I would like to propose to leave the 26-28 Undermountain Road lot as is.

I am writing to you regarding tonight's continued discussion of:

I think the decision between Option 1 and Option 2 should be resolved by a survey of the people who park there as well as those that abut the land and the management team from The White Hart.

But if a survey cannot be completed, I plead for Option 1.

The parking to attend events either at The White Hart or town wide activities such as the Memorial Day parade and the Fall Festival demonstrate that we do not have enough parking in Salisbury. My wife and I park in that lot at least three times a year and we do so because there are no other good options. I am not sure I have ever seen it unused.
